THE YEAR OF THE BLIZZARD

The 2005 Mari Sandoz Heritage Society Conference focuses on Mari Sandoz's 1954 novelette Winter Thunder, the story of a courageous school teacher and students who attempt to survive a sudden Sandhills blizzard.

The poster for the conference and the cover of this program is reproduced with the permission of the Museum of South Dakota State University. It is a print, "After the Blizzard," by South Dakota artist Harvey Dunn. Sandoz had a great fondness for Dunn

and his artwork, in part because he too had been born on a Plains homestead. In 1961, the same year Sandoz published her book, <u>Love Song to the Plains</u>, she wrote a tribute to Dunn for <u>American Heritage</u>. In this essay, she used stories and personal experiences to tease meaning from Dunn's landscape paintings, including the cover print. This essay would win the annual Western Heritage Award for best non-fiction article about the American West given by the National Cowboy Hall of Fame in 1962.


