
Who Was Mari Sandoz?

Each year the Society presents the acclaimed Raleigh and Esther Pilster High Plains Lecture at Chadron State College and provides support for the Story Catcher Writers Workshop and a writing scholarship at Western Colorado University. The Society publishes a newsletter, maintains a website and supports a variety of other scholarly activities including a research award. Most recently, the Society has stepped up to provide support to the Northern Cheyenne Journey Home Committee and their work on the planned Northern Cheyenne Healing Trail located near Crawford, Nebraska in the northwest corner of the state.

Sandoz Research Scholarship

The Mari Sandoz Heritage Society encourages research on Mari Sandoz and her work by offering an annual research award of \$1,000 for proposals that emphasize new insights on Sandoz or new approaches to her life and work. Proposals are accepted from August 1 of the current year to July 31 of the following year. Proposals are evaluated on the articulation of the research question, the context of the broader theoretical/historiographical issues significant to the topic and the significance of the overall project to the field of Sandoz research.
